3. MODERN SLAVERY POLICY STATEMENT

As a business operating within the UK, the key areas of our operation that could be affected by slavery and human trafficking are within the workforce of our supply chain and other service providers who supply services to our business ("Service Providers").

Hub North Scotland Limited ("The Company"), in partnership with our Service Providers, is committed to, as far as is reasonably practicable, ensuring that we take appropriate and proportionate steps to mitigating the risk of slavery and human trafficking occurring within our business and that of our Service Providers.

- o We require all Service Providers to ensure their employees have the right to work in the UK.
- We consider all Service Providers' approaches to employee rights and any breaches of human rights related legislation during our selection process.
- o We require all Service Providers to consider the risk of modern slavery in their own supply chains.

It is essential that management and all parties working in partnership recognise their duty to cooperate with our policy.

This policy will be formally reviewed annually, or as otherwise required by legal change, whichever is the earlier.

The policy will be circulated to the service providers and others affected by our works and will be displayed on The Company website.
